We are very proud of our four House banners.




Scottish Parliament Trip

Chemistry Week Celebrated at Breadalbane Academy

Chemistry week happens every year during November and this year pupils at Breadalbane Academy were lucky enough to be able celebrate in style. S2 and S3 pupils were able to welcome researchers from the University of St. Andrews as part of the chembus scheme and were treated to demonstrations involving liquid nitrogen and dry ice and then were allowed to try to a range of experiments which included turning copper coins into what looked like gold (actually brass). A really exciting experience and a great learning opportunity! In addition to this, senior pupils were able to borrow an infra-red and U.V. spectrometer, worth around £60000 from the Royal Society of Chemistry to perform cutting edge experiments on. All in

London 2013

Breadalbane Academy has recently organised two separate trips to the capital city of London.

August 2013: English/Drama Trip

In August 2013, the English and Drama department embarked upon a literary cultural tour of London for S3 and S4 pupils. Activities included London sightseeing, attending the Natural History Museum and shopping in Covent Garden, but the two highlights were attending performances of 'Macbeth' at the Globe Theatre, followed by a literary/theatre workshop and 'The Lion King' in the West End! Both pupils and staff were overwhelmed by the professional standards of the performances and the quality of the sets and musical scores. Whilst both performances were extremely different, pupils thoroughly enjoyed each one. Each day in London was long – getting up at 7am and going to bed at 11.30pm – with no rest all day! However, the pupils involved wouldn't have had it any other way and really did find it to be the experience of a lifetime!

November 2013: Expressive Arts Multi-Disciplinary Trip

In November 2013, Breadalbane Academy facilitated an expressive arts multi-disciplinary trip for S5 and S6 pupils. The departments involved were Art, Music, Drama and Fashion & Textiles. The activities pupils experienced were designed to assist them in their chosen arts' examination studies, but were also extremely enjoyable. Highlights included a night-time tour of London to see the Christmas lights and the window displays of the large department stores; a shopping trip to Harrods; a visit to McCullough and Wallis fabric and textiles emporium; a visit to the Victoria and Albert Museum (where pupils could view costumes from past famous West End performances and scale-models of the puppets used in 'The War Horse', as well as jewellery and metal-work exhibitions and the 'Fashion Through The Ages' exhibit); a tour of the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane...before culminating in going to see a performance of 'The War Horse' by the National theatre.

All pupils and staff involved found the experience to be absolutely invaluable: both from an educational perspective and for entertainment value!

Senior Mathematics

Professor Andrew Rae from the University of the Highlands and Islands came in to school at the end of November to deliver a highly enjoyable talk on how mathematics and physics support the design of wings. He illustrated how air flow at different speeds create an imbalance in pressure, creating lift for aeroplanes, grip for racing cars and forward movement for racing yachts. Around 30 pupils from S4-S6 attended the talk and found it entertaining and informative. Many expressed an interest in researching this topic further.
