2)	<ul> <li>Letter from John Swinney.</li> <li>PC met with Murdo Fraser on 11<sup>th</sup> February.</li> <li>PC met with chair of committee on 18<sup>th</sup> February- potentially a 6th process but were not able to discuss what this was.</li> <li>Review to be brought forward to the end of March.</li> <li>PC sent request through J. Duff to see with the CEO as they think the process is flawed.</li> <li>A. Pointer felt meeting with SNP made progress, also made progress with politicians as a lot of statements were backtracked.</li> <li>PC met with ECS team to ask why they weren't informed- ECS stated it was because Breadalbane parents were not directly affected.</li> <li>R. Hill confirmed that the decision was made by the senior management team of the council e.g. Sheena Devlin, Sharon Johnson.</li> <li>A pointer stated he has no confidence in state review or any trust in officials.</li> <li>P/C asked officials about stopping the review- they said they can't due to legal reasons however the politicians can if they want to.</li> <li>A. Pointer worried there will not be advanced higher opportunities if this goes ahead, and may have to be distance learning.</li> <li>PC met with administration group and they didn't know what was going on.</li> <li>G. Dow asked for dates- states team were to have meeting on 20.2.19.</li> <li>PC not sharing all information on flawed process- but will use this is any decisions are made.</li> <li>J. Duff- Highland Ward Counsellor introduced himself to group.</li> <li>Advice was given to not stop state review as it is already in phase 2, the procedure is satisfactory and to carry on with the process- this was legal advice.</li> <li>J. Duff to take feedback to S. Devlin and C. Shire.</li> <li>G. Dow asked if this all started due to PHS needing a maintenance repair and is all the money gone, so is this why a review is needed? J. Duff confirms this is not true and review started in 2015.</li> <li>A. 	<ul> <li>PC have Thrift Shop from 12<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> May.</li> <li>£1000 outgoings committed from now until October, including P3 sea life centre, ski snow trip, nursery uniform.</li> <li>PC has applied for funding to go towards medals for kids taking part in Sports Day as an incentive for children who dislike sports.</li> <li>Application submitted for £50,000 towards the primary playground.</li> <li>End of year parties to continue as successful in 17/18 year.</li> <li>PC spoke to Pupil Council to come up with a way to make primary Sports Day more exciting for all children who are less motivated.</li> <li>EL thanked LHu for her efforts applying for grants etc.</li> </ul>			

4)	<ul> <li>Gaelic</li> <li>Funding for a teaching assistant had been secured after a successful campaign led by the Gaelic Parent group</li> <li>Gaelic got 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in John Muir Poetry Competition out of many schools.</li> </ul>	
5)	<ul> <li>Frozen Meals</li> <li>EL provided an update.</li> <li>BA to be impacted- a CPU in Dundee will blast freeze meals for use in primary schools across Highland Perthshire.</li> <li>This is to be actioned from August 2020.</li> <li>Online campaign set up by a parent at local school to argue against this.</li> <li>Nutrition not to be impacted, however it was discussed that meals currently are not at a highest of standard.</li> <li>There are a number of benefits, e.g. saving money, local produced used, standardised of quality.</li> <li>Open tasting sessions to be brought to schools- confirmed by J. Duff.</li> <li>Will provide wider menu choice and make it easier to comply with dietary requirements.</li> <li>Reduce waste.</li> <li>GS asked how many catering jobs in BA will be lost- J. Duff to find this out and let PC know.</li> <li>Concerns that this will mean taking money out of PKC.</li> <li>SH asked how long these meals will lie in BA freezers before being served to kids?</li> <li>AP asked why this decision was made without consulting or informing any Parent Councils in PKC.</li> <li>E. Laurie to send campaign around.</li> <li>Only effecting schools using Tayside Contracts - other schools in Scotland have adopted this process.</li> </ul>
