	 RS advised that the process is ongoing and he had reviewed the candidates for short leeting. There were approximately 9 candidates, with 6 being short leeted, and candidates included some internal candidates. PC will be involved in the interviews, providing 2 interviewers and a standby. Stage 2 interviews are being held around 11th May.

10.	Anti-Bullying	
	 There was lengthy discussion around both bullying and anti-social behaviour. It was noted that school staff are rarely visible outside school at leaving times and that some secondary pupils are sometimes seen smoking or vaping, just outside the school building. This clearly sets a bad example for younger pupils but also looks bad from both a parent and public perception. It was also mentioned that reports of bullying were not always promptly acted on or followed up, and some school staff were too quick to make excuses for the bullies' behaviours rather than listening to and supporting the victims / families.
